CHALLENGING THE STATUS QUO

The HSUS is proud to present as part of this year's annual conference a one-and-a-half-day symposium addressing one of the most politically sensitive and polarizing of all animal-protection issues: the use of animals in research. Experts in the fields of research, testing, and education will discuss current alternatives to the use of animals; unacceptable uses of animals; and the use of primates from the wild and cats and dogs from shelters as research subjects. The eminent speakers will consider the lack of public accountability in animal research. In the keynote address, a prominent physician and clinical researcher who is the chairman of The HSUS's newly formed Scientific Advisory Council will bring a fresh perspective to the animal-research issue. In addition, the first annual HSUS Russell and Burch Award will be presented to a researcher who has made an outstanding contribution to the advancement of alternatives to the use of animals in research and testing.
